

Pinebrook Fire-adapted Landscapes And Safe Homes (FLASH) Program

Pinebrook has been awarded grant funds from the Utah Watershed Restoration Initiative (WRI) which are available to Pinebrook residents through June 15, 2024. A maximum grant award of \$6,000 per property is available and awards will range from 25% to 75% of the cost of each project!

Completion of this application will notify the committee of your interest in participating in Pinebrook's Fire-adapted Landscapes And Safe Homes (FLASH) Program. As a participant, you'll be preparing for wildfire by reducing hazardous vegetation around your home and/or other strategic locations on your property. Your responses will help us determine whether you are a good candidate for the FLASH Program.

Grant monies from the Utah Watershed Restoration Initiative are available to reimburse qualifying homeowners for a portion of appropriate work on their private property. Higher rankings of candidate properties will be given to

1. Properties adjacent to or near areas of open space on which past or planned fuels work has or will occur,
2. Properties adjacent to other private properties participating in this Program or which have done significant fire safety work in the recent past, and
3. Properties in identified critical areas of risk

Before proceeding, please be aware of the following:

- Completion of this form does not guarantee financial assistance of any kind.
- This application is intended to capture the interest of property owners in the Pinebrook Community and information provided will be used by the Pinebrook Fire Safety Committee to objectively rank and select recipients.
- Have at least two (2) contractor bids for project work in PDF or image format
- Have two (2) "before project" images of work area. Please take the images from the same spot where "after project" images will also be taken.

Types of fuel treatment work covered by this grant includes:

- Brush removal
- Tree trimming
- Chipping
- Tree thinning
- Services will NOT include: trash removal, weeding, moving wood piles, landscaping, removal of large root systems or other ground-disturbing work, or site preparation for new construction .
