Wildfire Emergency Planning Information

Proper preparation saves lives and prevents injury.

The information below and on the reverse page will assist you in being prepared for a Pinebrook wildfire emergency. We encourage you to post this handout near a commonly used exit from your home.

GET READY!

Sign up for Summit County Alert Notification System: https://summitcounty.info/getalerts Sign up for Wildfire updates, fire conditions & outlook, and more by texting "SCFIRE" to 91896

Prepare now:

- Familiarize yourself with your specific home's evacuation route via map on reverse.
- GO-KITS (see below) near exit door.
- Flashlights in/on bedside tables.
- Water gallons/emergency food in garage.
- ID collars and microchips on pets/consider what you will do with your pets during an evacuation.
- Determine your "safe locations" at least 5 miles away from Pinebrook Park (home of friend or family member or other location).
- Make inventory/video of home contents.
- Learn how to open garage if you lose power.
- Family meeting to go over this handout.

Keep the following information accessible on phone and near exit door:

- Evacuation map (on reverse)
- Elderly/handicapped neighbor cell numbers
- Contact person cell number (person to coordinate messages if household is separated)

Prepare a GO-KIT for each person in a clearly marked bright colored bag /backpack. Include:

- Evacuation map
- Gloves (work gloves)
- Goggles
- Prescription eyeglasses (extra)
- Masks (N95 & plain) & t-shirt to cover face
- Wipes/hand sanitizers
- First Aid kit & OTC medications
- Prescription medications
- Extra chargers for cell/laptops
- Change of clothes/underwear/jacket
- Emergency foil blanket
- Cash/extra credit cards
- Flashlight/extra batteries
- Copies of important documents (passports, IDs, birth certificates)

GO! - EVACUATION CHECKLIST

LEAVE IMMEDIATELY IF ORDERED TO DO SO OR IF YOU FEEL UNSAFE.

Evacuate by foot only as a last resort.

- Check/call neighbors.
- Place pets safely in cars or, if pets can't be found, leave out water/food.
- Drink water/stay hydrated.
- Notify contact person of safety status and evacuation plans.
- Take cell phones/laptops/chargers.
- Wear long sleeves & pants, sturdy shoes.
- Take GO-KIT(s).
- Take fueled vehicle(s).
- Turn on headlights/recirculated air and tune radio to 91.7FM.
- If trapped, stay in building or vehicle.
- Follow designated evacuation route unless unsafe or if instructed otherwise by public safety officials (maps/routes on reverse).

Only if time permits:

- Tape note to front door indicating that you have evacuated (include contact info) or that you plan to stay.
- Shut all windows and doors (interior too).
- Leave on outside/inside lights.
- Shut off HVAC/ceiling fans.
- Turn off propane tanks and move them away from home.
- Turn off outdoor sprinkler system.
- Unlock or prop open fence gates.

To alleviate traffic congestion, please follow your designated route out of Pinebrook unless unsafe or instructed otherwise.

Please familiarize yourself with your zone and evacuation route before a fire emergency, and learn a second evacuation route just in case. After reaching the bottom of the Pinebrook community, proceed to one of your safe locations at least 5 miles away from Pinebrook Park.
